Revival of the Pacific Youth Council (PYC) Secretariat

'The revival of the PYC Secretariat has been very timely', says PYC President, 23 year old Ms Jacque Koroi (pictured) of Fiji. 'After humble beginnings in 1996 and supported by a hardworking Executive of representatives from throughout the Pacific, the time was right to strengthen and institutionalize the Council so it could effectively serve the young people of the Region'.

In the true spirit of partnership and Regional networking, the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC), AusAID Pacific Leadership Program (PLP), and PYC had signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to support the initial establishment of the PYC Secretariat, including hiring of a full-time Secretariat Coordinator.

The Secretariat is being hosted by the SPC Community Education Training Centre (CETC) in Narere, 8 miles out of the city of Suva and 4 miles from Nausori Airport. The new Coordinator, Ms Tarusila Bradburgh, commenced on October 1st and hopes to strengthen the role of PYC, establish better linkages with NYCs, and build stronger partnerships with Government Ministries, Departments, Divisions of Youth and Regional Youth Organizations in the Region.

PYC MISSION:

The PYC shall nurture the promotion of unity, equity and solidarity of Pacific Youth in search of their interests, needs and development.

PYC OBJECTIVES:

The Pacific Youth Council has five (5) objectives for the period 2006-2009. They are:

1. Strengthen Youth Networks at all levels in the Pacific and thereby promote a regional identity through the exchange and dissemination of information.

2. Encourage and strengthen Territorial and National Youth Organizations in the Pacific.

3. Promote the interest and development of Pacific Youth.

4. Identify and secure available resources to support the PYC and Territorial and National Youth Bodies in the Pacific.



5. Cooperate with Governments and administrations of the Pacific to advance the development of Pacific Youth.

The Pacific Youth Council is guided by an existing Constitution and a work-plan until 2009.

Meet the PYC Executive Team

The members of the PYC Executive were elected during the 3rd Pacific Youth Council General Assembly (GA) held in Tahiti in July 2006. The PYC GA was held in parallel with the 1st Pacific Youth Festival.

Support for PYC Crucial says SPC Youth Adviser



SPC's HDP Youth Adviser Ms Rose Maebiru. Rose brings with her a wealth of youth work experience and knowledge to advance Regional youth development work.

'With the re-activation of PYC Secretariat, members need to renew their relationship and engage with the Council to enable further cooperation and joint effort in youth development. Young people and youth agencies alike need to dialogue with PYC with the aim of taking action to support the current efforts and collectively address issues that affect young people', says SPC Youth Adviser, Ms Rose Maebiru.

As the Regional focal point for non-government and voluntary youth organizations in the Pacific Islands Countries and Territories (PICTs), PYC plays a very important role at the

Regional and also at the National level. PYC provides a platform where its members can converge, share, support and raise critical issues to be address regionally and internationally.

Youth issues and concerns can be dealt with at national level but certain matters need collective effort and voices for greater impact and this is where PYC comes in; not on its own, but in collaboration and partnership with other regional partners and stakeholders.

Ms Maebiru issued a challenge to the young people of the region to 'step forward and talk to youth organizations / programmes in your countries and the regional organizations to discuss what you and your peers would like to do together with the organizations to address your issues'.

SPC sees PYC as a key partner in implementing youth priorities identified by its members.

At country level, the Human Development Programme (HDP) (Youth) of SPC works with the government youth departments and in many countries, the national youth departments work in collaboration with PYC members (National Youth Councils).

SPC through the HDP will continue to support PYC and its members and will work closely with them to provide services for and with young people.

AusAID PLP Strengthens Youth Leadership in the Region

The AusAID-funded Pacific Leadership Program (PLP) is actively supporting the re-establishment of the PYC Secretariat. PLP commenced in early 2008 in Suva, and works in partnership with existing Pacific organizations that are strategically placed to address leadership issues in the region. PLP supports partner organizations to work on their core business, and to grow stronger as organizations, so they can contribute to the development of future models of leadership for Pacific Islanders. It provides funding and technical support to the PYC Secretariat in Suva.

For the PLP, a partnership with the PYC seemed like a perfect fit. As Regional Program Manager Yeshe Smith confirms, 'we are thrilled to be working with PYC. As the only representative peak body for youth in the Pacific, it has a critical coordination, information sharing and advocacy role to play. With a strong, effective PYC, there is enormous potential to achieve great things for youth leadership in the region'.

PLP is also developing national programs in six initial focus countries - SI, PNG, Vanuatu, Samoa,

Tonga & East Timor. This has allowed PLP to meet national and local youth reps, and to learn more about the particular challenges confronting young people in those countries. It is hoped that PLP may soon build partnerships with some youth bodies at the national level; to help young people access leadership roles in their countries, whilst recognizing that a regional body such as PYC is only as strong as its national members.

Pacific Youth Festival in Fiji Planned for July 2009

Profiles of PYC Executive Members

Fiji will host the 2nd Pacific Youth Festival (PYF) next year at which 1400 participants from 30 Pacific island countries are expected to attend.

Minister for Youth and Sports, Mr. Filipe Bole launched the theme '*Actioning the Youth Agenda*' and the Logo competition for the 2009 Pacific Youth Festival.

Mr. Bole said that the honour to host this event was entrusted to Fiji during the Conference of Youth Ministers of the Pacific Community that was held in Port Moresby in 2005.

The 'Actioning the Youth Agenda' theme will be used as a basis for discussions and speeches (delivered by known advocates and academics of the region) during the week-long event, with the aim to help contribute to building a better Pacific.

'More importantly, the symposium component of the Festival aims to monitor and report on the progress of implementation of the Pacific Youth Strategy 2010 since the last Festival in Tahiti', Mr. Bole said. He said that the theme for the event is important for delegates, who on returning to their homeland are obligated to adopt resolutions at the Conference into the programs and initiatives of their relevant Ministry and Youth Organizations.

Collective Voice for Young People is Important

The new Cook Islands National Youth Council (CINYC) President Ms Nukutau Pokura believes that it is **absolutely important** to have a collective voice for young people.

'Nuks', as she loves to be called, sees the Council playing a valuable role in advocacy, as a networking coordinating mechanism, and a conduit of change for positive youth development and a promoter of youth mainstreaming and decision-making. There are times when young people are disillusioned when it comes to decision making processes, due to their inexperience or lack of opportunities to become knowledgeable or skilled in these areas.

A body such as the CINYC gives young people the control and opportunity to decide, reason, research, implement and report from their perspectives; allowing them to recognize their skills and limitations in what they

own interests and determine what they can and cannot do to make life easier for themselves, their peers and also for generations to come.

First and foremost Nuks wants to build a rapport amongst her Council members so that team work is evident and equity is practiced within. In partnership with relevant stakeholders in the Cooks Islands finally establish the CINYC Secretariat and launch the Council in 2009.
